We, SOCOTEC Certification Japan (hereafter "SOCOTEC"), have performed a limited assurance engagement, in response to the entrustment from ITOCHU Techno-Solutions Corporation (CTC) (hereafter "the Company"), in order to provide an opinion as to whether the subject matter information ("FY2021/FY2022 Scope1,2,3 Calculation Report" (applicable period: 1 April 2021 to 31 March 2023)) of the Company meets the criteria in all material respects.

1 Subject Matter Information and Criteria

The subject matter information for our assurance is "a report on energy-derived greenhouse gas emissions and HFCs emissions (Scope 1, Scope 2 (location-based and market-based)) and all other indirect greenhouse gas emissions that occur in a company's value chain (Scope 3 (Categories: 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 11, 12, 13, 15))" covering the operations and activities of the Company and its consolidated companies in Japan and overseas (8 domestic subsidiaries and 6 overseas subsidiaries) described in "FY2021/FY2022 Scope1,2,3 Calculation Report" (applicable period: 1 April 2021 to 31 March 2023).

The criteria for preparing subject matter information is "CTC Group GHG Emissions Scope1, 2 Calculation Procedure (Ver1.2)" and "CTC Group GHG Emissions Scope3 Calculation Procedure (FY2021/FY2022)".

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2 Management Responsibility

The management of the Company is responsible for maintaining adequate records and internal controls that are designed to support the reporting process and ensure that “FY2021/FY2022 Scope1,2,3 Calculation Report”(applicable period: 1 April 2021 to 31 March 2023) is free from material misstatement whether due to fraud or error.

3 Assurance Practitioner’s Responsibility

The responsibility of SOCOTEC is to express a limited assurance conclusion as to whether the subject matter information has been prepared in compliance with the criteria in all material respects.

SOCOTEC performed limited assurance engagement in accordance with the verification procedures stipulated by SOCOTEC and “ISO14064-3: Specification with guidance for the verification and validation of greenhouse gas statements”.

The procedures implemented in the limited assurance engagement are limited in their type, timing and scope as compared to the procedures implemented in the reasonable assurance engagement. As a result, our limited assurance engagement does not provide as high assurance as reasonable assurance engagement.

Our procedures performed depend on the assurance professional practitioner’s judgement, including the risk of material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Our conclusion was not designed to provide assurance on internal controls. We believe that we have obtained the evidence to provide a basis for the conclusion for limited assurance.

4 Assurance Procedures

The procedures that SOCOTEC has conducted are based on professional judgment and include, but are not limited to:

- Evaluation of policies and procedures created by the Company in relation to subject matter information
- Questions to the Company personnel to understand the above policies and procedures
- Verification that the target project meets eligibility requirements
- Matching with the basis data by trial calculation and recalculation
- Obtaining and collating material for important assumptions and other data
- We visited Kamiyacho Head Office ,Kudan Office (including CTC Technical Solution Center and CTCT Learning Center) and Koraku Office of the Company in order to confirm the calculation structure and procedures, data collection and implementation status of record control.

5 Statement of Our Independence, Quality Control and Competence

SOCOTEC has introduced and maintained a comprehensive management system that conforms to the accreditation requirements of "ISO17021 Conformity assessment -- Requirements for bodies providing audit and certification of management systems".
